

AGE 05 01: Practice and Review

1. Practice writing out the Greek prepositions and their English meaning, organized by their cases, as given in the Vocabulary Review for AGE 05.

e.g.: Prepositions that take the genitive case are as follows:

ἀντί, ἀντ'/ἀνθ' instead of, for the sake of
etc.

2. Some Greek prepositions can only take one case, some two, others three. Rewrite the Greek prepositions, this time organized by the number of possible cases each can take. Besides each preposition, list the case(s).

e.g.: Prepositions that take only one case are as follows:

ἀντί, ἀντ'/ἀνθ', genitive
etc.

Prepositions that take two cases are as follows:

διά, δι', genitive, accusative
etc.

3. A list of Greek prefixes derived from prepositions is given on our Vocabulary Review. For each, using a dictionary or your own knowledge of English vocabulary, try to come up with one English derivative that uses the same prefix.

e.g.: ἀμφί, ἀμφ': amphitheater
etc.
